## Dear Jack:

I wanted to take some time before writing and commenting on our trip to Europe. To be honest, the 12 day trip went bye so fast, it all seemed like a blur to me. I wanted to have time once we got back home to Dallas to sort out all that happened on the trip. On the ride to Bregenz we stopped in a small mountain town in the Black Forest for lunch. From Bregenz we visited the local casino and visited a museum instead of the trip to the ski slopes we had planned. We had planned a day of skiing and snowboarding for the kids – but no snow. Europe was having a warm winter. From Bregenz we traveled to Salzburg, Austria for site seeing. It was in Salzburg when I found out what a GREAT trip we were on!!!
